Spectacular New Zealand Secondary Schools Championships!

The CSC athletics team ended 2017 in spectacular fashion. Six athletes travelled to Hastings over the first weekend in December to compete at the NZ Secondary Schools Track and Field Championships. This is a premier athletics event and one where our future NZ athletes are identified.

And that is what happened for our own Dylan Forde. Dylan had a clean sweep of the 800m heat, semi final and then final to become the NZ senior boys (Under 19) champion. This was the event of the meet for us. There was yelling, screaming and many tears shed by the whole Southland contingent watching Dylan win his final. The win opened many doors immediately for Dylan as he was invited into the NZ athletics team and taken into the elite coaching fold. A win like this does not happen easily. Dylan has done athletics for 7 years and has built his high level of fitness and skill alongside the resilience to keep coming back after injury and hard races. Dylan was awarded a sports scholarship to study and train at Lincoln University this year. Watch out for his name in the future.

Southland Secondary School athletics is coming up in March. Only the top two placings qualify to go to the South Island Secondary schools event in Timaru. This is a change this year as there is no longer the Otago-Southland competition. So - get training!







ATTENTION ALL CSC ATHLETES

We have a busy Athletics season ahead of us. This begins with the CSC Athletics Sports on Wednesday 28th February. The top three from each event will qualify for the Southland Sports to be held at Surrey Park Invercargill on Friday 16th March.

A major change to the Athletics Calendar this year is there is no Otago/Southland event. Instead, the top two placegetters from the Southland meet will qualify for the South Island Championships to be held one week later on 23rd - 25th March in Timaru. Due to the extremely short turnaround in these two events, the school will not be organising transport or accommodation for Timaru. Accommodation will be at a premium and we urge parents to make bookings early if you think your child will qualify for the South Island event. The school will take care of entries for this event.

Year 13

Careers staff have met with Year 13 students to give an outline of career events and opportunities that will happen over the year with the Careers Department. All students are being interviewed this term, and it is our role to help them as they plan for their next step, whether that be study or employment. We encourage every Year 13 to investigate a Plan A and Plan B for 2019.

STAR

CSC receives funding which enables us to pay for students to attend tertiary type courses while they are still at secondary school. Some of the funding is used to run programmes on-site here, such as First Aid, Hospitality, and Travel and Tourism. We explained to Year 12 and Year 13 students this week that there is also funding available for some students to attend SIT one day a week for 10 weeks. Students were to register their interest with Careers this week if they wanted to be considered for this opportunity.

First Aid

The year started early for 27 Year 13 students when they gave up the last day of their holidays to complete their First Aid Certificate. Their tutor was very impressed with our students, commenting on their manners, and the respect shown.

Gateway

The Gateway programme also got underway with the First Aid course at the end of the holidays. Gateway students have been given an update of the individual Unit Standards they will be studying in class and for many of our Gateway students, we were even able to tell them where they would be working for one day a week during this year.







NCEA Guide: Mobile App*

This App has been designed to help parents and employers better understand NCEA, NZQA has developed this app designed for mobile devices - phones and tablets. Called NCEA Guide, the app is for parents, whānau and employers and provides quick and easy access to key information about NCEA.

The NCEA Guide includes key content about the structure of NCEA, how the qualification is used after studying, how credits work, and how endorsements are earned. Users can also choose to view the content in English or Te Reo. Importantly, parents and whānau can also get information about how they can support family members studying towards gaining their secondary school qualification.

For employers, content focuses on what they can expect to see when job candidates show them documents detailing their qualifications and what they have studied.

Students School Accounts

Accounts will be emailed/posted soon. You will notice there are some camps and trips; these do not need to be paid until your student is due to go. This gives you notice of what costs are for the year.
