CSC Success at the Southland Science Fair

Year 10 student, Sam Davidson won a Bronze Award at the Southland Science Fair last week. He worked independently all year to further develop the project he started last year. His summary is as follows:

“In my project I tried to find a way to remove plastic particles from a marine environment. I made a machine that could filter out small particles of disposable single-use plastics, which people throw away on a regular basis, from a body of water. I found out that I could filter the majority of plastic out of a certain area during testing, but only after I had attached an electric pump to the machine I created. This contraption has many potential applications, including cleaning up wharves and marinas”.



We are very proud of Sam’s achievement, especially as he did all the planning and investigation himself. His project is very relevant in our world today. We are looking forward to following Sam’s progress and innovation in the future.
