## STUDENT NEWS

### Food & Nutrition Level 3

In Level 3 Food and Nutrition we have been studying nutritional issues in NZ. There is an issue of young people making poor breakfast choices. Breakfast is an important meal of the day, it helps your physical and social wellbeing as well as 'brain power' for students to further increase their studies and grades. This also improves what the students can be in the future and achieve higher goals.

Breakfast can be as easy as eating toast with jam, eating two pieces of fruit or eating a pie on the go. These will also prevent students getting hungry in the middle of class and concentrate more. The issue at CSC is only 22% of Year 9's eat breakfast 2 to 3 times a week of school days. This is a problem as breakfast is an important meal of the day. Without breakfast, students may have a hard time doing their work in class and feel moodier or sleepy. Eating the right type of food can help students feel active and better longer than eating sweets for breakfast.

Our goal was to increase the number of students eating breakfast every day by showing the students how easy it is to prepare food for themselves or others. This can also give families ideas what to have for breakfast and set out quick and easy food for their family. We had to implement a plan to try address the issue. We held a nutritional workshop day for the Year 9's where every student attended 3 different activities all centred around the positive impact of breakfast. There were games and videos to try engage the students. 36 lucky students also won a spot prize to cook a nutritional breakfast. All students received a goodie bag that they could take home to share with their families.

We hope that with this action plan the students will have an opportunity to share their knowledge of healthy breakfast/food choices with the community in the future, and also positively enhance their well-being.
