We have 1,800 trees being delivered from 'Trees That Count' in autumn next year and look forward to getting these into the ground. We will have an ongoing spray programme over the next few years to help keep the weeds and grasses under control.

Annie Keown, the Teacher in Charge of this project is leaving the college at the end of this year to pursue new challenges. We are very thankful that Annie has indicated that she wishes to continue working on the Trees Project to see it come to fruition. Annie has worked tirelessly and given a huge amount of time already driving this project. We look forward to seeing Annie around CSC in the future.


