MOTOR CROSS CHAMPS

South Island Motor Cross Country Champs

Our MX team had a great day out on Sunday 10th October at the South Island Motor Cross Country Championships at Tapanui.

The event offered a mix of senior, junior and farm bike novice riders a chance to compete with students from all around the South Island. The weather was perfect, the course a good mix of dry and swampy challenges and there was a buzzy, excited atmosphere all day.

For our newer riders, sitting in a start line with 50 plus competitors lined up was the first of many battles. MX Cross Country requires the riders to complete a set course as many times as possible in $1\frac{1}{2}$ hours, so the fastest with the most laps wins. The bikes are set up with transponders which automatically record each lap. The riders have to judge their fuel usage and make pit stops to refuel both body and bike.

It's an awesome sport and we were pleased to be able to get to this event after it was postponed in September.

The riders truly appreciate the support they get from their parents, who almost had more fun than the kids on the day!
